That the letter from Mr. Emerson Esq. be
acknowledged that the sum of two pounds
per acre clear of Tithe and Land Tax be
offered for the whole field, that the term
should be for seven or fourteen years
which ever term was most acceptable
to the client

Carried Then on
to meet the requirements of the Otago
applicants it was resolved that Councillors
Mr. Grumble & Wines be deputed to wait
upon Mr. H. Thomson and ascertain if he
were disposed to relinquish the occupation
of the three acre field to the Council at
Michaelmas next upon an equitable arrangement
for remuneration

The Council having resumed
The Chairman introduced the question of
standing Orders and suggested that on consequence
of the engagements of two members of its Committee
it should be postponed

the Cess-pools, with air shaft if needed.
Put nine inch drain pipes where there
are now six inch pipes, with no alteration
to present depth of drain"

"That the plan and specifications be left open
for tenders until Friday evening next
for improved pipe from Mr Gallants to
Pond. The drain ^{from Pond} past Hodd's to
Riggs entrance be taken up raised with
nine inch pipe and Cess-pools repaired
and improved. Mr Searg supported this
views and suggested that the local tradesmen
be invited to send tenders to Council
