Tenders for same were given by Messrs
 Bracey & Tutter the latter with drawing has in
 favour of Mr Bracey whose tender for
 75 yards was 4/- per yd = 15-0-0

Cess. Pools

1-10-0 £ 16-10

Upon discussion in which all members took
 part, Messrs Scary Love & Zoman offered to
 cart sand necessary to fill the drain level
 to the road. Mr Bracey therefore agreed to
 reduce the amount for piping to 12-3-9 and
 for an additional sum of 3/- to make two
 Cess-pools in accordance with the specifications
 which sum 15-3-9 was unanimously accepted

Black St Drain

An application was made by Councillor Bracey

 unanimous approval of the Council to have
 one placed opposite the property of Mrs Jew
 the other south of the existing one and
 adjacent to the Highway

4TH JUNE 1895

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Mr. Jutter proposed and Mr. Blyth seconded that Mr. Suttons House be chosen as the most suitable place for the erection of an Air pipe. That the Clerk be authorized to communicate with Mr. Sutton and arrange to connect his drain with the main by a 6 in pipe

Rural District Council Receipt

Mr. Blyth proposed & Mr. Bracy seconded that the Overseers withhold payment of the RDC Receipt re Mr. Hewitts charge. That a copy of such resolution be forwarded to the District Council.

Upon which Mr. Love submitted that such resolution should stand over until next meeting of Council as Mr. C. M. Wideman had a notice on the RDC's Agenda with reference to the matter

Mr. Loves suggestion was adopted

Sub Committee re Drainage

It was unanimously agreed that Messrs Blyth & Jary see those persons who are desirous of connecting with main drain, and inform them that the Council will permit them to connect if trap^s at their end & their drains free from silt. The Council then adjourned.
