A letter from Mr C R Edwards to Chairman was there complaining of the imperfect state of the Drains leading into the Pond opposite his residence.

Mr Love suggested that Mr E's letter be entertained that the three drains opposite Mr Edwards' also four emptying into Pond opposite "Hemp Arms" be enclosed by a wood troughing of a triangular shape, Councillor Rust recommended a square as being more able to resist bushage from vehicular traffic.

Council Meeting

A special meeting was held at the Board School on Friday the 4th / 9th / 1896^{S. 1896} to receive a report from the Committee appointed on Tuesday the 28th July last to carry out a resolution for the improvement of Drainage at the different Ponds in the parish.

Present Messrs Bracey Tutter Izary Knights
and Barnes

Mr Rex Pymon Vice-Chairman Presided

Mr Bracey reported that in conjunction with other members appointed by the Council he had investigated the question of Drainage of & to the Ponds. To effectually improve the same it would be necessary to face one side of the "Kings Arms" Pond with Cement which would with outlays at other Ponds cause an expenditure of 30£ To do it in a less expensive way, say with Cider about 12£. Messrs Pymon, Izary & himself had a diffidence in expending either sums on their own responsibility and sought the opinion of the Council. Or perhaps the Council could suggest some temporary remedy so that the question could stand over to a more convenient season than the present as recent heavy falls of rain have rendered any improvement more expensive to carry out.

Correspondence re Ditches
A letter received from Mr Edwards complaining
of the imperfect state of Ditches to the Pond
opposite his residence led to a discussion which
ended by the Committee receiving the unanimous
support of the Council to take steps at once
for the abatement of the nuisance
Mr Knight proposed
Mr Tracy Junr seconded

That both Ponds
be done forthwith. The Pond opposite to
Mr Edwards' to have precedence

Carried
Trustees of Good Charity.
Common Farm - repairs

Mr Tracy Junr addressing the Chair was
desirous of learning what position he occupied
as a Trustee; He had ordered Mr Jungate
to proceed with the repairs and if he were
to exceed his position it was unintentionally
but trusted the Council would not withdraw
authority for Mr Jungate to complete work
as the material was placed on the Farm.
The Chairman informed Mr Tracy his
position as Trustee was same as other members
of the Council. On 21st June /95 the Charity
Comm^{rs} transferred the Charity to the Council
when it became vested in the Council as
a Body, but with regard to the order issued
to Mr Jungate that was a matter for the Council
to deal with.

Vice Chairman Pyman stated he had seen
Mr Jungate, it was a question of about 12£

he thought it would be advisable that the

agreed to

a Committee of Three be formed for the
purpose of interviewing the Lord of the Manors
to protect the Herbage & prevent the Green
being disfigured and the Turf destroyed
